Minutes of DNS Monthly Meeting

It is their perception that the wolf cull is inherently cruel and unethical, and is accomplishing nothing in the interests of preservation of the southern mountain caribou. The influence of people through various activities such as building communities, roads, industries, have all fragmented the caribou habitat and the herd is so small that they will likely die off due to lack of genetic variety.
