DELTA NATURALISTS SOCIETY MEETING – Minutes

Draft 3

Tuesday, March 5, 2019

Welcome: President Tom Bearss welcomed everybody, including several new faces in the crowd, and introduced the executive present. He thanked Vice President Elizabeth Perrin, absent due to family health reasons, for chairing the February meeting. Tom then promoted our regular 50/50 draw overseen, as usual, by Mike Betts.

Minutes: Joyce Manary moved approval of the circulated, draft minutes of our February 2019 meeting. Jennifer Melville-Roberts seconded the motion, which was carried. These minutes are posted on our Members Only website.

Mail: Treasurer Jim reported that no mail was received during the previous month.

Treasurer's Report: Jim tabled the Feb. 28, 2019 financial report. It details several miscellaneous deposits and one small expenditure in February, producing a bank balance of \$6,959, little changed from the end of January. Treasurer Jim also reported that two membership applications were received during the previous month.

Acknowledgements: Tom reported that Audrey is recovering from her fall but is yet unable to get back to producing her very informative *newsletter*. Tom thanked Geof for production of yet another, highly artistic *poster* advertising our speaker and her presentation. Finally, Tom turned to our *social convener*, Joanne, who thanked everyone who brought treats for our enjoyment tonight. Joanne commented that we're seeking a volunteer to host our annual June garden party. Paul and Carol Rennie indicated, in response, that they are interested in hosting this social gathering at their home in Richmond.

Environment Issues: Anita reported that several provincial rod and gun clubs have recently promoted contests to kill predators. This is reprehensible. BC Nature is signing on to a letter of protest to the provincial government.

Susan Jones reported that the Roberts Bank port expansion proposal review process is continuing. The proposal is to double every facet of this port facility. This has significant environmental implications. Public hearings are about to commence. One must register by March 22 in order to be able to speak at them. Written submissions are due by April 15.

Bird Box Team Report: Peter Ward reported on behalf of the team. He expressed appreciation for the \$2,000 grant that Delta Nats recently received from BC Nature in support of our barn owl next box building program. This will provide sufficient funding for materials to build 6, latest generation, nesting boxes. Construction of these new boxes will start soon, even while the team is looking (in consultation with other knowledgeable people, including farmers) for suitable sites to place them.

Notable Sightings: The Casual Birding group saw a Hawk Owl this morning during their outing to Pitt Meadows. Val reported seeing a female Sharp-shinned Hawk eating a rat near her house.

Next Meeting: Tom reminded us that our next monthly meeting is on Tuesday, April 2 at the regular time of 7:30 and the regular, Lutheran Church venue. Bev Ramey will speak on Double-crested Cormorants.
