WELCOME: Tom introduced the executive, welcomed visitors, and commended Geoff for his craftsmanship in preparing the poster for this month's speaker.

MINUTES: The minutes of September 8, 2014 were approved, after Jim Ronback so moved and Valerie Fuller seconded.

ENVIRONMENT: Several issues were discussed:

 Jim Ronback reported that he is making a presentation to the CRTC in their hearing to determine if KRPI is in contravention of the Canadian Broadcasting Act. This is with respect to their broadcasts from the USA to a Canadian audience. KRPI does not have a Canadian licence.

- Jim: VAPOR has launched a judicial review of the environmental review process used by the BC EAO to grant an Environmental Certificate to proceed with the jet fuel facility project on the banks of the Fraser River.
- Anne Murray: Port Metro Vancouver has held "consultations" with the public on the environmental mitigations for the DeltaPort Terminal 2. Naturalists should become educated on this issue and join in the public process a this area is extremely important habitat for migratory birds and other wildlife on which the Port expansion would have significant impacts. Port Metro's projections for the expansion of trade by shipping are suspect and their plans for environmental mitigation are inadequate. Ursula Easterbrook asked if Anne could provide a sample letter to the Port which members could use as a base for their comments.
- Anne and Marilyn also mentioned that the Delta Naturalists' Society's proposed changes to the Delta Tree Cutting Bylaw will be the subject of a Council workshop. Lynn Moses has requested a date of Monday, December 15th. More details to come.
