Martin Gregus Jr. is a nature and wildlife photographer and Artist, with a great visual presentation on Snowy Owls.

Martin travels globally to capture his unique and brilliant Nature photos, some of his work is also published in National Geographic Magazine.

We all learned some interesting facts about:

- Snowy Owls- are born Grey to blend into the Yukon Tundra, they also can be found in the Hudson Bay Tundra. They hatch in June, feed, grow and prepare for take off to our Southern climate with flying lessons in August, then migrations soon after. They can be found in the Boundary Bay area from November to April (if we are lucky) Adults are completely white in color.
- Eagles' natural habitats are in BC, Yukon and Alaska, many reside year-round in BC. Bald Eagles follow the Salmon Run.
- Salmon runs have been failing repeatedly over the past 4 years.

We are very honored and delighted to have this presentation to our group this eve.

At the conclusion of Martin's presentation, Elizabeth thanked Martin for his time and efforts to join our meeting, it made for a really great evening for everyone.
