Tony Mitra gave a 10 minute presentation on the use and impacts of glysophate (aka RoundUp) on our environment. The railway had sprayed glysophate on the vegetation surrounding the railway tracks in White Rock. The U.N. has recently declared this chemical a probable carcinogen. Tony was meeting with Council members from both White Rock and Delta councils on this issue. He recommended a recent book by an American lawyer; the book is "ALTERED GENES, TWISTED TRUTH" by Steve Druker. Tony also mentioned a retired Canadian scientist, Dr. Thierry Vrain, who is outspoken about the harms of GMO foods. Tony is a Delta Nats. Member.
